YWCA Supportive Housing Initiative



What: A beautiful new \$6.9 million investment in our community (24) 1-bedroom Supportive Housing apartment units, Empowerment Center Office Space Including Community Space for meetings, educational and employment opportunities, warming and cooling space, laundry and showers.

Where: 399 6th Avenue South

How: This project is fully funded through the follow resources:
National Housing Trust Fund awarded a historic \$4.4 Million dollars for the construction of the 24 1BR supportive housing units.
The City of Clinton pledged \$500,000 as a one-time award for construction.
The Clinton County Board of Supervisors pledged \$500,000 as a one-time award for construction.
An anonymous donor has pledged \$500,000 towards an Operational Reserve account for ongoing operations.
Federal Home Loan Bank has awarded YWCA Clinton \$1.5 million for the construction of the 24 apartment units.

Who: People in our community experiencing chronic homelessness. Often in need of more supportive services, facing a greater number of barriers to health and wellness, and thus self-sufficiency.

Details: Empowerment Center staff will have offices on-site. Every client in supportive housing programs is assigned a Case Manager. Community-based supportive services providers may meet with clients on-site as space is available. Services may include mental health providers, substance misuse/abuse treatment providers, educational opportunities, workforce development opportunities, religious/spiritual supports, peer-to-peer supports, etc.
